

BIRD WALK AT ESTRELLA MOUNTAIN REGIONAL PARK  
October 8, 2016



At 8:10 AM we began our 2.5 hour bird walk through the east side of the park , through the Mesquite Grove, Red Gum Eucalyptus and grass area then north through desert scrub, and finally through the riparian area along a dry river bed, to the ponds on the east end of the park. The temperature was 82 degrees F at the beginning and 90 degrees F at the finish. Skies were cloudy the entire time with some clearing around 10:30. Showers to the north in the early morning hours may have discouraged some from joining us. Wind increased through the hike from 5 mph to around 8 mph from the east.
