BIRD WALK AT WHITE TANK MOUNTAIN REGIONAL PARK

November 28th, 2015

Species: Red-tailed Hawk, Costa's Hummingbird (visitor center), Mourning Dove, Gila Woodpecker (visitor center), Gilded Flicker, Say's Phoebe, Loggerhead Shrike, Verdin, Canyon Wren, Cactus Wren, Black-tailed Gnatcatcher, Curve-billed Thrasher (audio), European Starling (flyover visitor center), Yellow-rumped Warbler, Black-throated Sparrow, House Finch (visitor center) 16 species

Comments: 1. Good looks at a soaring Red-tailed Hawk, southwestern morph, riding thermals below and above the ridge. 2. Black-throated Sparrows perching up on cholla, jojoba. 3. Wren calls are so variable that what was first called a Rock Wren morphed into a Canyon Wren by the time we got good looks. 4. A great group of birders with 4 good photographers among us, offering pictures with better resolution than even the spotting scope provided.
