## BIRD WALK AT ESTRELLA MOUNTAIN REGIONAL PARK October 8, 2016



At 8:10 AM we began our 2.5 hour bird walk through the east side of the park, through the Mesquite Grove, Red Gum Eucalyptus and grass area then north through desert scrub, and finally through the riparian area along a dry river bed, to the ponds on the east end of the park. The temperature was 82 degrees F at the beginning and 90 degrees F at the finish. Skies were cloudy the entire time with some clearing around 10:30. Showers to the north in the early morning hours may have discouraged some from joining us. Wind increased through the hike from 5 mph to around 8 mph from the east.
