ESTRELLA MOUNTAIN PARK BIRD WALK 3 14 20

CONDITIONS: Ideal!! 58 degrees F at 7:45 AM with clear skies and a breeze1-3 mph from the NE: walk was finished at 10:00 AM with a temperature of 69 degrees F and skies sprinkled with fair weather cumulus clouds and a breeze of 2-3 mph from the NE.

ROUTE: Our trek was modified due to possible flood and mud issues approaching the mitigated ponds to the east. The trail taken led through the east side of the park, observing birds in the Mesquite Bosque, the Blue Gum Grove, grass areas, desert scrub, then on to the Gila River Riparian Trail west of Vinyard Avenue.

COMMENTS: Truly one of the best days to be birding after the three day rain event that left close to 3 inches of precipitation in parts of the valley. Many birds, such as the Gila Woodpeckers, were rattling to mark territory, Northern Mockingbird males were singing enticing songs to impress the females, several male Phainopeplas were flitting back and forth when not perched atop a mesquite or paloverde, and the local resident Vermilion Flycatchers sparkled our visions with their reddish orange plumage. A real plus

was a kettle of Black Vultures. Chipping Yellow-rumps and whining Lesser Goldfinches accompanied us along the trail.
