## **ESTRELLA MT PARK BIRDWALK 3-9-24**

CONDITIONS: Ideal! Temperature 53 degrees F at 7:30 am under mostly clear skies with some altocumulus and small cumulus clouds mostly too the east of the park: at 10 am the temperature was 61 degrees with clear skies, some altostratus, alto cumulus clouds and a breeze from the NE at 3-4 mph.

ROUTE: Observations were made around the Nature Center, the group caravanned to the east side Navy Area, walked west through the Mesquite Bosque and Blue Gum Grove, then returned through the irrigated grass area, then along the edge of the Desert Scrub to the parking lot. Some of our group crossed Vineyard Ave and made some sightings along the south trail adjacent to the Gila River and the mitigated lakes.

COMMENTS: The spring bloom was present, although most of the flowers on the stalks were invaders, such as mustard types and Stinknet with a sprinkling of globemallow here and there. Recent rains had stimulated the increase in green we saw everywhere. The bird group we saw were mostly residents of this riparian Sonoran Desert ecosystem. Small flocks of White-crown and Lark dominated the sparrow group. A Western Meadowlark was seen, some Lesser Goldfinches, the colorful Vermilion Flycatchers, and one glossy Phainopepla.
