ESTRELLA MT. REGIONAL PARK BIRDWALK 4 8 23

CONDITIONS: Ideal. Clear skies at 7:30 am, temperature at 54 degrees F, little to no breeze:: at conclusion, 10 am, still clear skies, 78 degrees, little to no breeze.

ROUTE: Observations were made at the Nature Center, then the group caravanned to the Navy Area on the east side, toured the Mesquite Bosque, Blue Gum Grove, the grassy areas and desert scrub region north of the parking lot. The group then crossed Vineyard and began the south riparian trail along a very high and flooded Gila River, thus the walk terminated due to flooded conditions.

COMMENTS: The main source of excitement for this day was the flooding river out of its banks in several areas. So much water being released from reservoirs to the north and east produced a bloated river and rushing current, something seldom seen in our lifetime. The abundant flower bloom continued as spring began to

quickly merge into summer. Stinknet, the invader from South Africa, had just taken over in many areas of Maricopa County, as between Brittlebush, Desert Marigold, and Stinknet, yellow was everywhere. The magenta blooms from Hedgehog Cactus were also present. Lots of swallows were seen today and 4 flycatcher species. The return of the Western Kingbird, filling the air with its vocalizations, was a happy moment for all.
