CONDITIONS: At 6:30 AM the temperature was 88 degrees F with partly cloudy skies (cirrus, alto cumulus, alto stratus,), with a breeze from the SE at 4-5 mph: at 9:30 AM the temperature was 93 degrees F, same partly cloudy skies and a breeze from the SW at 2-4 mph.

ROUTE: Observations were made around the Nature Center, then the group caravanned to the east side Navy Area and walked the trails through the Mesquite Bosque, Blue-Gum Grove, irrigated area, and returned through the north parking area, observing in the Desert Scrub area.

COMMENTS: Summer was well in force as the blooming time for spring and early summer vegetation had all but eclipsed. Seed capsules dominated the remains on Sahara Mustard and Stinknet. Velvet Mesquite had linear seed pods approaching maturity. Juveniles from ground squirrel families were rushing here and there from burrows. The avian group were mostly the usual residents with Vermilion Flycatchers the most colorful and visible of the birds we saw. Several gum trees had Western Kingbirds vocalizing to each other.
