CONDITIONS: Ideal!!! Clear skies with a 48 degrees F at 7:30 AM with no breeze:: Clear skies with a 65 degree F temperature at 10 AM with a very slight breeze 0-1 mph from the east.

ROUTE: The route this day did not vary from past walks: Nature Center, Navy Area, irrigated region, desert scrub, south riparian trail along the Gila River to the mitigated ponds east of Vineyard Avenue.

COMMENTS: The morning was cool and the birds were sitting tight, waiting for Mr. Sol to breach the horizon and generate some warmth. Strange was the absence of dove species, especially Mourning Doves, as they are usually present in numbers. No egret species were sighted either. The Ruby Crowned Kinglets were back and a flock of American Wigeons graced the sky. The usual v-formation flying Neotropic Cormorants were present in numbers close to 100. A Northern Harrier was sighted and two Red-tailed Hawks. Always a delight are the Vermilion Flycatchers.
