CONDITIONS: 36.9 degrees F at 7:45 AM, clear skies, no breeze:: at 10 AM the temperature was 40 degrees F, clear skies and 0-1 breeze from the NE.

ROUTE TAKEN: Observations were made around the Nature Center, then the group caravanned to the Navy Area and walked the Mesquite Bosque, Blue Gum Grove, the grassy areas, and finished by walking through the north parking lot near the shrub adjacent to the desert scrub section.

COMMENTS: This was a chilly morning as the temperatures were in the high thirties into the low 40's. With hunters active just beyond the horizon, the walk

was limited to the park area. The usual suspects were present, but the large group of Lark Sparrows and 2 pairs of Cactus Wrens added a little variety. The ever present Vermilion Flycatchers added color to our eyes. The Yellow-rumped Warblers, our most common winter warbler resident, was chaperoned by a couple of Orange-crowned Warblers. American Pelicans also were seen exhibiting their V formation in flight, heading west.
