CONDITIONS: Ideal. Temperature at 8 AM 51 degrees F, clear skies. Little to no breeze:: at 10:30 AM, temperature at 71 degrees F with a NE breeze at 1-3 mph, still clear skies with one contrail.

ROUTE: Observations made around the Nature Center, then the group caravanned to the Navy Area at the east end of the park: hike was through the Mesquite Bosque, Blue Gum Grove, grassy area, then returned through the north parking lot via the desert scrub (mostly saltbush and brittlebush).

COMMENTS: This was a cool morning and many birds were waiting on some sun warmth to become active. The usual suspects were present, but the air waves were quiet for the most part and sounds were few and far between. The American Pelicans seen early just before sunrise and the Dark-eyed Junco were specialties

on this day. The Red-naped Sapsucker added some color to our sightings along with the ever present Vermilion Flycatchers.
