CONDITIONS: At 7:30 AM skies were clear except for a few altocumulus and alto stratus clouds on the east horizon, temperature 68 degrees F with 0-1 mph breeze from the east. At 9:45 AM, walk's conclusion, skies were clear, except a few lingering clouds to the east, a temperature of 78 degrees F and a slight breeze of 1-2 mph from the east.

ROUTE: Observations were made around the Nature Center beginning around 7 AM. The group then caravanned to Area 4 and walked the Black Rock long loop and returned to the Area 4 parking lot.

COMMENTS: This walk along the Black Rock Loop could be called the "Day of the Wrens and Thrashers" as these two groups seemed to dominant the airwaves with vocalizations. Canyon Wrens, Rock Wrens, Cactus Wrens along with Curve-billed Thrashers and an occasional Northern Mockingbird were the noise makers. We also had good looks at Loggerhead Shrikes and Black-throated Sparrows and a couple of towhee types. The resident Mourning Doves were also about in numbers.
