WHITE TANK MT. REGIONAL PARK BIRD WALK 11 26 22

CONDITIONS: At 7:30 AM skies were clear with some haze over the Phoenix Metro Area to the east. Temperature at 48 degrees F and no breeze. At the walk conclusion at 10 AM, skies were still clear. Temperature of 71 degrees F and a slight easterly breeze 1-3 mph.

ROUTE: Observations were made around the Nature Center beginning around 7 AM. The group then caravanned to Area 4. The Black Rock Loop long loop was taken. Later some of the group went to the Horse Staging Area and visited the small pond near the windmill.

COMMENTS: The trek was accompanied by the wonderful Sonoran Desert silence along much of the way. Vocalizations by Cactus Wrens, Rock Wrens and tinkling twitters from Black-throated Sparrows were part of the avian symphony. Ruby-crowned Kinglets, Yellow-rumped Warblers and flocks of Mourning Doves were present. A somewhat abnormal number of Loggerhead Shrikes were also seen. Lots of House Finches, a couple of Say's Phoebes, and some Costa's Hummingbirds were hanging around the bird feeders at the Nature Center.

Black-throated Sparrow 20, White-crowned Sparrow 7, House Finch 14, White-throated Sparrow 1 (26)
