CONDITIONS: At 7:45 AM the sky was overcast (stratus, altostratus clouds) with a temperature of 61 degrees F and little to no breeze::: at 10 AM the sky was still overcast, 72 degrees F and a breeze of 1-2 mph from the north, northeast.

ROUTE: Our route did not vary from February. Observations made around the Nature Center, then the group caravanned to Area 4 and hiked the Black Rock Long Loop. Some birds observed at the Area 4 parking area

COMMENTS: An unusual day due to the overcast. The flora of early spring was in full bloom dominated by Brittlebush and Blue Dicks, Globemallow, and some lingering Fiddlenecks. Buds were forming on the Buckhorn Cholla. The bird colony was represented by the usual suspects which

included Curve-billed Thrashes, Cactus Wrens, White-crowned Sparrows, and Black-throated Sparrows. Not often seen but here today were two Lucy's Warblers and a Black-throated Gray Warbler. A couple of Common Ravens gave us a flyover.
